My favorite toilet is the <u>UltraMax</u> by Toto. Toto calls this a "Power-Gravity" toilet. The model number is MSS854114S. It is a good looking one-piece that incorporates a 3" flush valve instead of the standard 2". The fill valve can be found in any hardware

store. It meets commercial requirements, works well in a home and is quieter than the air assisted models.

Some parts of the country that have poor water quality (sand, rocks, ect.) work better with gravity toilets. (non-assisted toilets flush using gravity) Some of the gravity toilets work very well with one flush. Excellent are the Toto <u>Drake</u> and <u>Ultramax</u> series. Good are the <u>Gerber</u>. Toto, St. Thomas and <u>Western</u> toilets.

Briggs has a model called the <u>Vacuity</u>, that uses the WhisperVAC flushing system. (<u>WhisperVac</u> is a patented vacuum assist) The water surface area is 10"x12".



Handicap style toilets with the higher bowl height (17" instead of 15") seem to perform better than the standard height toilets.

Some of the low flow toilets, such as the Kohler Rialto have little water in the bowl. Low water depth prevents

the waste from dropping below the water line. A toilet that has good water depth, will prevent "outhouse smell".

A few comments sent to me by other plumbers:

"I used to have these same problems with the 1.6gal toilets. Time to tell the customer to bite the bullet and get a new **Western, TOTO** or one of the other brand toilets that work! Since switching several of our customers to <u>Western</u> and <u>TOTO</u> we no longer have the standard call backs on toilets that don't flush." *Moshe Levine, Levine Plumbing and Const. Tonasket, WA*

"I think the <u>Toto</u> is one of the big trade secrets out there." *Rod Lampert, <u>Lampert Plumbing Co</u>.Phoenix, Arizona*

<u>"The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California</u> has cofunded the replacement of about 1.5 million 3.5, 5.0 and 7.0 gallon toilets in their service area. Through that process, the District Water Conservation Staff have come to learn which units are the best performers and are rated the highest by residential customers. Of the 1.5 million, most are at the low end of the cost spectrum so Metropolitan's experience does not extend to some of the higher priced models that you report. The American Standard <u>Cadet</u> and <u>Toto CST703</u> units are ranked by everyone as superior performers and the ones water agencies and their customers like the best. The flush well and customer complaints are nil." John Koeller, P.E.

If a client asks me, which brands have the most variety in styles and models, I point out **Kohler** and **American Standard**

Below are some quotes from Fine Homebuilding, <u>Oct/Nov 1997</u> that may amuse owners of the early 1.6 toilets.

<u>Terry Love</u> of <u>Love Plumbing & Remodel</u> in Redmond, Washington, says, "Most customers who get 1.6-gal. toilets for the first time have to learn to use a plunger, and believe it or not, a lot of people don't know how to use a plunger."

According to Love, there's a right way to plunge a toilet. "Put the plunger in with water in bowl, and after a series of short, quick strokes, pull up until everything sucks down. Usually people do big strokes up and down. Using that method, some blockages won't move."

<u>Al Dietemann</u>, of the Seattle Utilities Department, is concerned that many of the new toilets are coming with inexpensive flappers that deteriorate and go bad in a very short time. He feels that if the manufacturers would spend just a little more on the flapper, replacements wouldd be needed much less often. Leaking flappers are a source of wasted water in a home. The city of Seattle is now engaged in a water study to determine savings of the new water efficient fixtures. <u>click here</u> for more information and pictures.

"<u>Fluidmaster</u> and Coast now manufacturing some excellent product that withstands the in-tank bowl cleaners. The latest problem is that of replacement (after-market) flappers and the fact that most will not maintain 1.6 gpf in the toilets tested." John Koeller, P.E.

> *FLUSHMATE*-equipped toilets use pressure (not gravity) and have proven themselves to be THE superior <u>alternative</u> to



gravity-type low consumption toilets.

New items

Caroma is now bringing in their dual flush toilets from Australia. These will flush with either 1.6 or .8 gallons per flush. You will note that they are marked with the half and full markings on the buttons.



Toto has a new toilet called the <u>Carlyle</u> skirted one piece toilet with concealed trapway that is field <u>adjustable from</u> 10" to 14".



Also the new ADA compliant handicap two piece toilet called the <u>Drake</u> with the 3" G-Max flushing system. The standard and ADA version of the Drake expect to be a top performer for commercial and residential use.

Gerber Plumbing products has a new one piece toilet called <u>"Maurice" #21-012</u> that uses the new Sloan Flushmate III 503 Series.

Crane makes a wall hung 1.6 GPF replacement toilet called the <u>Rexmont</u>. This model comes in elongated 15" height and elongated ADA height of 16.5" The <u>Rexmont</u> is a gravity model.

American Standard has introduced their <u>new Cadet EL</u> with an added siphon jet for a better flush action.

Poor toilets

Many new homes come with poor working toilets. Among the most common is the Mansfield Alto #130-160. Just fair is the Kohler Wellworth. Against the Flow

The <u>Penal-Ware</u>[®] line by Acorn Engineering is virtually indestructible, able to withstand a 2 1/2 ton load. Products included in this line are, the Comby (a wash basin/toilet combination fixture), toilets, urinals, security showers, drinking fountains, modular service centers (this includes a toilet, wash basin, mirror, shelf and light fixture in one unit) and wash basins.

Zoe Washlet bidet seats



Toto makes toilets seats with a warm water wash called a <u>Zoe Washlet bidet seat</u>. For colder climates, they also make heated seats in both the Warmlet and the Zoë Washlet heated model.

Panasonic IntiMist Bidet seats

Panasonic makes the <u>IntiMist Bidet seat</u>. The controls mount on the side of the seat. An added feature is the additional spray nozzle.

Daelim bidet seats

Daelim makes a bidet seat with a heated seat and air dry

Sewage Ejectors

In cases where there is a need to add plumbing below the height of the existing sewer, a <u>sewage ejector</u> can be installed which pumps the liquid and solids up to the waste lines.
